


YARD OF THE MONTH

Ducks - Part 2

Please Help the Waterfowl Continued from February Messenger

That's a lot of birds!

Everyone has seen it. You throw a few breadcrumbs out for a handful of ducks and before you know it, dozens if not hundreds of birds have flocked to you. And while this is cool to see, it is not good for the birds. When too many ducks or geese live in a small area, it is easier for the birds to catch diseases and get each other sick. Since we don't want our feathered friends to get sick, please don't feed them and contribute to their overcrowding.

Eating bread has side effects?

Another problem when people start feeding ducks and geese is the birds lose their fear of humans and can become more aggressive, while also being easier prey for animals that eat ducks and geese. Some birds will also die because they cannot compete for the natural resources or the human handouts.

Having too many birds in one place is also not good for the environment. The birds can become a nuisance by grazing on grass, and excess nutrients in ponds caused by bird droppings can result in water quality problems. Uneaten food can pollute the water and can also attract other animals and pests.

Ducks and geese will eat almost anything they find including litter and old fishing supplies like lead weights. Please leave the



natural environment in its natural state and throw away your trash.

What can you do to help?

- Please don't feed the waterfowl.
- Help educate others about why feeding ducks and geese is not good for the birds.
- · Pick up your trash, and any other trash you see in the park, litter can hurt birds in so many ways.
- · Don't let kids or dogs chase the waterfowl.

Typical waterfowl diet:

- Grass, weeds and clippings
- Earthworms
- Small fish and fish eggs

- Small crustaceans
- Algae, aquatic plants and roots
- Frogs, salamanders and other amphibians
- Aquatic and land insects
- Seeds and grain
- Small berries, fruits and nuts

Even though these are the foods ducks and geese should eat, please don't feed them to the birds - waterfowl will become dependent on us for food.

Coffee Grounds Are Worth Saving

Gardens, flowerbeds, plants and your lawn will look and be better when used coffee grounds are applied. It is easy, simply sprinkle coffee grounds around indoor and outdoor plants, add the grounds to potting soil or distribute directly on your lawn and water it in. Rhododendrons, hydrangeas and azaleas use the nitrogen and acid from the coffee grounds for amazing blooms. You can also add coffee grounds in your watering can for a nitrogen boost as you water. Coffee grounds add organic material to soil, improving drainage, aeration and water retention.

Prevent ants, snails and slugs by using coffee grounds as a barrier around plants or apply to areas where these pests are known to frequent as a repellent. The caffeine in the grounds are said to negatively affect pests and the pests avoid the area.

To sharpen your garbage disposal blades, merely run water in your sink and add one tablespoon of grounds to a running disposal.

When cleaning dishes and utensils, a teaspoon of old coffee grounds can be poured onto your dish cloth to scour grease and grime away.

Next time you wash your hands after cooking, cutting or dicing foods like garlic and fish, grab a small scoop of old coffee grounds, mix with soap, lather together in your hands to help remove the odors.

For an artsy antique looking piece of paper, soak an old cloth in a mixture of used coffee grounds and water then blot the edges of the paper with the cloth. Be sure you use an old cloth as coffee stains.

If you use real wood in your fireplace and know the mess of cleaning out the ashes, try scattering old coffee grounds over the ashes to cut down on the flying dust.

Coffee grounds can also be used to eliminate odors. Fill a bowl with coffee grounds and place in the fridge or freezer. Use dry coffee grounds to soak up odors in your shoes overnight and in the morning shake shoes over trash bin before wearing.

Coffee grounds will mold unless reused within a day or two. To save coffee grounds, it is a good idea to dry them. Spread a very thin layer of coffee grounds on a cookie sheet, heat your oven to 350 degrees, then turn the oven off, place the coffee lined cookie sheet in the oven and leave overnight. Dry coffee will not mold and can be stored in containers for more uses!


New Fire Station No. 3

A new fire station no. 3 and fire training facility is under construction at the corner of Marshall and State Highway 161 to accommodate the expanding neighborhood. In addition to GrandCentral Park, The Epic, Epic Waters and The Summit, the area has experienced major retail and housing growth resulting in a larger volume of calls for the station.

The new 19,538-square-foot fire station will feature four bays for an engine, ambulance and truck, living quarters, a kitchen and an adjacent classroom. The station will house 10-12 firefighters, and 3-4 on the training side. A new water tower will also be built at the site. The new fire station no. 3 replaces the existing station on 1702 Robinson, and is scheduled to be complete in March 2021.

Blue recycling bags have been popular for years but hinder the recycling process by causing tangles and wrapping around equipment at the recycling sorting facility. Plastic bags can damage the machines and cause the sorting process to shut down.

Effective January 1, 2021, we will no longer collect recycling in blue bags (or other plastic bags). Recycling should be placed loose in your green recycling bin.

One 18-gallon green bin per household is supplied by the City. Additional bins can be purchased for\$5 each at the City's landfill.

- · Cartons (juice, milk)



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
