Pet waste is a health hazard and water pollutant. To help responsible pet-owners in our community, pet waste disposal cans are installed in high traffic walking areas for your convenience. - Pick up your pet waste. It is not fertilizer.
- Carry disposable bags while you are walking your dog to pick up and dispose of waste in (our new receptacles or) the trash.

- Bury pet waste in the yard, at least 6 inches deep and cover with soil. It will decompose slowly. Bury the waste in several different locations in the yard and keep it away from vegetable gardens.

CHECK IT OUT:

7 October Home Maintenance Tasks



- Clean your dryer vents. Excess lint can dramatically increase the risk of fire.
- **Seal outdoor surfaces.** Apply stain* and sealants before excess moisture or snow penetrate and cause paint to peel or wood to rot. (Yeah, this is Texas, but who knows! Also, fresh stain looks great-and it's required HOA maintenance.)
- 3. Store your yard furniture. Invest in durable covers or an outdoor shed**.
- 4. Winterize the hose. Before freezing temperatures arrive, drain and store your hose, and shield external faucets with foam insulation covers.
- 5. Feed and seed your lawn. Seeding is an effective way to repair damage from a long, hot summer. By seeding before the first frost, you can allow seeds to begin taking root in the soil for spring growth.
- Maintain gutters and downspouts. It's best to keep water flowing away from your house. If you feel comfortable, grab a ladder, or better yet, call a pro to check for leaks on the underside of gutters, the flashing around the chimney and any openings, like skylights, on the roof.
- * The approved Mira Lagos HOA standard stain is Wood Defender Semi-Transparent Stain Color - Rustic Oak). This product is available for purchased in bulk from the HOA office.
- ** An ACC Request Form must be submitted to the HOA office and approval obtained prior to any exterior changes or additions. The only except is when replacing plants or flowers in an existing flower bed.





MISD School Board Approves Lower Tax Rate

Mansfield ISD's tax rate has dropped from \$1.54 to \$1.46 per \$100 of certified property value. The MISD School Board approved the lower rate at the regular board meeting on August 27.

"With an 8-cent decrease of the tax rate in such an amazing school district, I want people to understand the value that they're getting for their tax dollars here," said Board President Karen Marcucci. "We appreciate the money that is sent to us, we take it very seriously, and we really try to do the best with it and be fiscally responsible."

Under the new tax rate of \$1.46, 97 cents will go toward the maintenance and operations (M&O) fund, and 49 cents is for the debt service fund.

The maintenance and operations budget funds daily costs and recurring or consumable expenditures, such as teacher and staff salaries, supplies, food, gas and utilities. The debt service fund is used to repay debt for longer-term capital improvements approved by voters through bond elections.

MISD's 2019-20 budget was approved in June.

Homestead Exemption?

You may apply for homestead exemptions on your principal residence. Homestead exemptions remove part of your home's value from taxation, so they lower your taxes.

For example, your home is appraised at \$100,000, and you qualify for a \$25,000 exemption (this is the amount mandated for school districts), you will pay school taxes on the home as if it was worth only \$75,000.

Taxing units have the option to offer a separate exemption of up to 20 percent of the total value.



To qualify, a home must meet the definition of a residence homestead:

The home's owner must be an individual (for example: not a corporation or other business entity) and use the home as his or her principal residence on January 1 of the tax year. If you are age 65 or older, or disabled, the January 1 ownership and residency are not required for the age 65 or disabled homestead exemption.

To get a general \$25,000 homestead exemption, you may file an Application for Residential Homestead Exemption with your appraisal district for the \$25,000 homestead exemption up to two years after the taxes on the homestead are due. Once you receive the exemption, you do not need to reapply unless the chief appraiser sends you a new application. In that case, you must file the new application. If you should move or your qualification ends, you must inform the appraisal district in writing before the next May 1st. A list of appraisal district addresses and phone numbers is available online.

Most questions about property appraisal or property tax should be addressed to your county's appraisal district or tax assessor-collector.

Pumpkin People Eater Craft

SUPPLIES NEEDED:

- 1. 12-14" Tall Foam Pumpkin (can be found at Michaels)
- 2. Sturdy artificial plant stem or large sunflower (can be found at Hobby Lobby)
- 3. Pencil or marker
- 4. Cutting/Carving tools
- 5. Acrylic Paints Green, Light Green, Red/Pink, White
- 6. Electric Drill

Begin by drilling a hole, the size of the sunflower stem, in the top of the foam pumpkin. The sunflower stem will later be placed in the top hole of the pumpkin.

Use a pencil or marker to draw a mouth 3-4 inches from the top of the foam pumpkin, making sure the opening is large enough to get a hand inside to grab candy. Once the mouth has been drawn, use the cutting/carving tool to cut out the mouth. Clean any dust or small pieces of foam from the pumpkin.

Paint the inside of the mouth red/ pink first and then paint the outside

of the foam pumpkin green and light green (giving it a textured, real look) including the top where the hole has been drilled. After the paint has dried, it is time to place the sunflower stem through the top hole of the foam pumpkin. Be sure and paint the section of sunflower stem red/pink so that it looks like a tongue...creepy!

Lastly, paint the teeth with the white paint. A 'feed me' tag can be added for fun. Now fill your pumpkin with candy to complete your Pumpkin People Eater project!
