



CROSSING GUARDS Mansfield or Grand Prairie?

The Mansfield ISD Police Department and Grand Prairie Police

Department serve Mansfield ISD with School Crossing Guards. Both hire part-time civilians to work selected street crossings and schools in our area.



The Mansfield ISD Police Department has a staff of 48 Crossing Guards, forty-seven who serve in the field and one who serves as the section

supervisor. The current Supervisor, Stephanie Denova said, "I am always accepting applications. This is a fantastic job for anyone to make \$500 a month with benefits and leave for two hours a day."

The following Mansfield ISD schools are served by Mansfield ISD Police Department School Crossing Guards:

- Judy Miller Elementary (two)
- Elizabeth Smith Elementary (one)
- Mary Lillard Intermediate School (five, Lillard & Jones)

Grand Prairie Police Crossing Guard Coordinator Michelle Green oversees 93 School Crossing Guards including eleven at nearby schools and two at the intersession of Grand Peninsula and England Parkway. Grand Prairie Crossing Guards work three hours daily in morning and afternoon shifts at \$9 per hour.

fall favorites DELICIOUS DESSERT RECIPES TO CELEBRATE AUTUMN

BEST PUMPKIN BREAD

- ¹/₂ teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon (ground)
- ¹/₄ teaspoon cloves (ground)
- 2 eggs
- 1²/₃ cups flour (all purpose)
- ¹/₂ cup pecans (chopped)
- 1 cup pumpkin puree
- ¹/₂ teaspoon nutmeg (ground)
- ³⁄₄ teaspoon salt
- 1¹/₂ cups Sugar (granular)
- ¹/₂ cup water
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- ¹/₂ cup oil (vegetable or corn)
- 9x5-in. loaf pan

Combine all ingredients folding in pecans last. Pour into a greased loaf pan and bake at 350° for 65 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean. Cool before removing from pan. Enjoy!

EASY CROCK POT HOT APPLE CIDER

- 2 quarts apple cider
- 1 orange, sliced
- 1 tablespoon brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon nutmeg
- ¹/₂ teaspoon cloves
- 2-3 cinnamon sticks

Place all the ingredients in the crock pot and simmer for 3-4 hours or combine all ingredients in large pot and simmer on the stove for one hour. Remove cinnamon sticks before serving.

PECAN PIE

- 1 Pillsbury pie crust (room temperature)
- 4 tablespoon margarine, softened
- 3 eqqs
- 1 cup light Karo syrup
- 1 cup sugar
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- 1¹/₂ teaspoon vanilla
- 1 cup pecan pieces
- 4 cup pecan pieces (keep separate)

Flour your glass pie baking dish (do not just use PAM spray, it doesn't work!) Soften /melt margarine in mixing bowl. Combine all other ingredients except last ¹/₄ cup of Pecans and stir with spoon and pour into unbaked pie crust. After it settles 30 seconds or so, fill in the open spaces without pecans with left over pecans. Lightly press on them to coat them with mixture but not move them. Cover Pie crust edges only with foil or crust covers. Bake in oven 450° for 10 minutes. Then reduce heat to 325° and bake for 35 minutes or until knife insert into center of filling comes out clean and middle appears more stable/solid.

PUMPKIN MOUSSE

- 1 can pumpkin puree (15 oz)
- 3/4 cup of sugar (superfine)
- 1/2 teaspoon Pumpkin pie spice
- 3 cups of heavy cream (separated into 1 cup to cook and 2 cups to whip)
- 1 tablespoon Vanilla

graham crackers – add crumbled up graham crackers to the bottom of your serving dish for a crunchy curst (optional) ginger snaps for garnish on top (optional)

Combine pumpkin, 1 cup of the heavy cream, sugar and pumpkin pie spice in a medium pan. Cook at medium heat for 5 minutes. Remove from heat and cool to room temperature. While the pumpkin mixture is cooling, whip 2 cups of the heavy cream and vanilla to soft peaks. Set aside to be folded into pumpkin mixture when cooled. If desired crumble graham crackers in the bottom of your serving dish for a crunchy crust. Pipe or spoon mousse into a serving dishes and chill. Just before serving garnish with crumble the ginger snaps or more graham crackers on top.

PREVENTING PACKAGE THEFT

It's the most wonderful time of the year — until your package gets stolen from your doorstep.

Want to avoid "crimes of opportunity"? Here are a few tips to keep your packages safe during the holidays:

- 1. Ask for a tracking number to know when your package is delivered. Track your packages and try to be home at the time of delivery. When you're placing an order, try to schedule shipment for a day you expect to be home, if possible.
- 2. Not sure if you'll be available for your tracked package's delivery? FedEx and United States Postal Service (USPS) suggest scheduling your delivery beforehand to set a time you know you'll be home.
- 3. FedEx also suggests requesting a signature for delivery. This will ensure the package won't be left at your door without you there to sign and bring it safely inside.
- 4. Want your package placed at the back door or behind a porch plant instead? Leave a note specifying what less conspicuous spot you would like it left. The FedEx Delivery Manager lets you leave delivery instructions on where you want your deliveries to be dropped off.
- 5. Have your packages delivered somewhere else. If you know you won't be home when your package will be delivered, FedEx and United Parcel Service (UPS) tell you to opt for delivering it to a neighbor who is home or to your workplace, if allowed.
- 6. Another option is to deliver your packages to a retail store or locker, where they'll stay safe until you can pick them up

at your convenience. Many retailers will let you place online orders and then pick up your items in the store. You can also look into the Amazon Locker service, which delivers Amazon orders to a "locker" in your area; you're provided a pickup code that will unlock the door for you. And the U.S. Postal Service suggests taking advantage of their Request Hold Mail service, which securely holds letters and packages at your local post office until you're back in

town. FedEx and UPS also have similar location delivery services.

7. UPS suggests signing up for a service called "UPS My Choice," which allows users to request their packages to be held at a UPS store for pick-up and more. You can control the service through text or email; it includes features such as delivery notices and the option to re-route your packages to a different address if you won't be home. You can also re-route your packages using the FedEx Delivery Manager.

hrysanthemums or mums are the perfect flower for fall. These gorgeous flowers come in amazing shades of yellow, orange, red and purple. Grocery stores, local garden stores and DIY stores are filled with mums, big and small. Mums can be a fundamental element in decorating during the fall season. These colorful mums together with pumpkins can make a fabulous impact on your front porch, flower beds and lawn for a vibrant fall vignette. Here are a few suggestions

for purchasing mums and keeping mums fresh longer. Search for a plant as it starts to break bud (little to no flower, only the bud), for increased bloom time. Check the plant tags to identify the color of the mum or check other plants that have begun to bloom as many stores try to group like colors together. Choose a darker shade of mum because darker colors look better longer and after the flower blooms they are less noticeable. A bigger, fuller plant is the best buy. Be sure to place mums in full sun, water often for moist soil (not wet) and pinch spent flowers which encourages more blooms.


